# Drone Deliveries Are Coming

These you can call drones ... The first FAA-approved delivery drones are coming to the United States. The FAA will allow collaboration between NASA, Flirtey, and Virginia Tech to fly unmanned aircraft to deliver pharmaceuticals to an underserved community in West Virginia. The organizations will use fixed wing and hexacopter craft to deliver up to 10 lbs of medicine up to 10 miles away.

Flirtey considers itself the world's first commercial drone delivery service. It began testing in 2013 in Australia, delivering over 100 textbooks as well as humanitarian aid in New Zealand.

What does this mean for us? It is my opinion that this is a good thing. It shows the FAA is being reasonable to allow unmanned craft to operate in the airspace. It would seem that hobby enthusiast use of model aircraft will remain in the good graces of the FAA.
